After Show and Tell and coffee, we will be having a hat making class.

THERE IS NO CHARGE

Remember how much fun we had with the shoe making class !!!!!!!

We can stay until 5:00, so there will be time to make a good start on a Red Hat.

It would be nice if members would stay and participate in the activity.

Bring your scissors and glue gun, or needles and maroon thread in case you would rather sew them. Straight pins to hold pieces together. That is all you need for this class.

Each person will be given a piece of maroon red felt with a pattern traced on it.

There will be 2 styles of doll size hats to choose from:

A ROARING 20'S STYLE HAT
A BRIM HAT

These hats will be the base for you to get started and start decorating.

We are going to have another competition just for these red hats. I am going to try and contact some of the RED HAT GROUPS and see if we can get 3 or 4 QUEEN MOTHERS out to judge them. This might be a good gimmick to get some publicity. Here's hoping.

You can decorate your hat at home or wait until the next meeting. This is where you put your own style and ideas into the competition.

This class will give you ideas so you can make another hat for the other competition..

We still will have 2 other tables of competition for 'PEOPLE'S CHOICE'.

Table 1 will be FANCY HATS.

Table 2 will be Knitted or Crocheted hats, or Baby Bonnets.

These hats can be ones you have made in the past or ones you make specially for the competition.

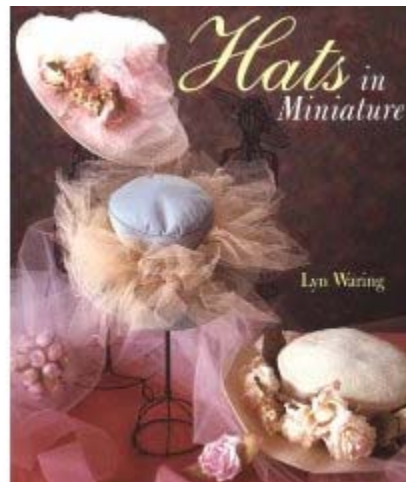
LOCAL SOURCE FOR KNITTING AND CROCHET:

Wolseley Wardrobe, at 889 Westminster Avenue (in Wolseley), phone 772-1393

Wolseley Wardrobe is a consignment store carrying quality pre-owned clothing. The proprietor also offers knitting classes and stocks a range of beautiful yarns, including silk blends, hand dyed yarns, and many specialty yarns. She also carries knitting and crochet supplies, books, and patterns.

If you are interested in needle felting she also has supplies and kits. This technique is used for hair, eyebrows etc. on cloth dolls and teddies as well as clothing and decorative items.

BOOK REVIEW:



For anyone who would like to pursue doll-size hat making, Lyn Waring's **HATS IN MINIATURE** is a great resource. Copies are being advertised through many on-line booksellers.

Complete patterns for 18 different styles, along with instructions on equipment, collars, seams, cutting, notches, batting, and other materials make the task simple. Bonus: instructions on making a hat stand, so you can display your creations! 128 pages (all in color), 8 1/2 x 10.

Faux Fur Trimmed Hat for American Girl Doll

Difficulty level: ★★☆☆☆ Easy

Free Knitting Pattern

Materials: Blue Red Heart Sport acrylic yarn - 1 skein.
White Lion Brand® Fun Fur Yarn - 1 skein.

Needles: 6 (5.5 mm) OR SIZE NEEDED TO OBTAIN GAUGE
Crochet hook 1 (2.75 mm)

Gauge: 16 st x 20 rows = 4" x 4" (10 x 10 cm)

Patterns:

Stocking Stitch and reverse stocking stitch.

Cast on 44 sts (including edge stitches).

Knit 6 rows of stocking stitch (SS).

Knit 4 rows of reverse stocking stitch (RSS).

Knit 4 rows of SS.

Knit 4 rows of RSS.

Knit 4 rows of SS.

For the back of the hat continue RSS. In each odd row decrease 10 sts. Continue for 8 rows.

Thread the end of the yarn through remaining stitches and tie the knot.

Finishing:

Join the back seam.

With white Fun Fur yarn trim the front edge of the hat and around the 1 st row of the back of the hat with 3 rows of single crochet.

Sew on ribbons at the ends of the front edge.
